Introduction:

- 5. The Rape of Nanking
 - PTSD

- 6. The Battle of Stalingrad
 - Infantry weapons/tactics
- 7. The Nuclear Bomb
 - Nuclear technology
 - Should the bomb have been dropped?
- 8. The Holocaust
 - Social Darwinism and Nazism
- 9. Nuremberg Trials
 - Nazis Leadership

You will take the topic that you've chosen and create one section of a Second World War history book. This page must include the following:

- a description
- pictures
- must be completed on 11" x 17" paper
- primary source document(s) this could be a picture of a document that you describe, or an analysis of a document or image that you find
- You must answer one of the following questions related to your topic of study:
 - Continuity & Change
 - What changes were brought about due to this event, technology, etc. or what type of continuity was established because of it?
 - Cause & Consequence
 - What were the consequences of this event, technology, etc.?
 (These consequences can be established based on the war as a whole or the effect on a group or individual)
 - Historical Perspectives
 - What were the feelings of the people at home or on the front toward this event, technology?
 - o Ethical Dimension
 - How was this event, technology, policy, etc or the consequences of this event justified at the time?
